## POWERING PARTNERSHIPS, BUILDING THE FUTURE: PROVEN RESULTS

**Defense & Security 2025**, the 12th edition of ASEAN’s leading tri-service defense and internal security exhibition, concluded successfully, reaffirming its position as a vital regional platform for collaboration, knowledge exchange, and business development. Building on more than two decades of industry recognition, the event brought together a strong international presence of manufacturers, official delegations, military leaders, government representatives, and industry professionals, with a continued focus on strengthening cooperation across the ASEAN region.

The exhibition showcased comprehensive coverage across land, sea, air, space, and cyber domains, highlighting advancements in defense systems, internal security solutions, cybersecurity, unmanned technologies, and space-related applications. Participants engaged in high-level networking and business discussions through a wide range of curated activities, including VIP exhibition tours, Government-to-Government (G2G) and Government-to-Business (G2B) meetings, business networking functions, technical presentations, and seminars, creating valuable opportunities for long-term partnerships.

A major highlight of Defense & Security 2025 was the International Seminar on **“Lethal Autonomous Weapon Systems (LAWS)”**, which drew strong interest from delegates and industry stakeholders. The seminar examined current and emerging trends in artificial intelligence, autonomous systems, cybersecurity, and unmanned technologies, while also addressing ethical considerations, international humanitarian law, and governance frameworks. These discussions provided valuable perspectives on future warfare and national preparedness in an increasingly complex security environment.

Aligned with the longstanding theme of the **“Power of Partnerships”**, the event emphasized the importance of cross-sector and cross-border collaboration—not only in defense readiness, but also in humanitarian assistance and disaster relief. Overall, Defense & Security 2025 received positive feedback from participants, reinforcing its role as a trusted meeting point for shaping the future direction of the defense and security industry in the region and beyond.




